REPORT ON THE YEAR'S ACTIVITIES - APRIL 1994 TO MARCH 1995

The year has been one of consolidation. The Trust, being once more in funds, has been seriously compiling an up-to-date Register of Buildings at Risk, based on the County Council's survey of properties.

In the Autumn of 1994, the Trust was approached by the owner of Moor End Farm, Walkeringham, which appears on the Register of Buildings at Risk. This is a mid-18th century dwelling, containing many of its original features and is little changed from its original design. To help finance the cost of restoration, which would exceed the value of the restored building, the owner agreed to sell sufficient land to the side of the listed building for a new dwelling to be erected. This, of course, would be subject to planning permission being obtained. The restored farmhouse and the adjacent plot would then be sold with conditions.

The Trust has employed an architect to carry out a feasibility study for the project and to prepare drawings for the new dwelling to be erected on the site. A solicitor has also been instructed to negotiate the terms of sale.

It may be recalled that legal work for the Trust has, in the past, been carried out by the County Council's solicitor. We have now been informed that this service is no longer to continue because of financial restrictions.

The newly formed Projects Sub-Committee has also considered Lock Cottage, Newark, Castle Station, Newark and properties in Southwell, Kimberley and Sutton-on-Trent in some detail. It is likely that some of these buildings will again appear in next year's report, as the straightforward schemes are handled commercially and the Trust pick up the more difficult projects, which require more lengthy negotiations.

The Trust continues to comment on planning applications which involve listed buildings or sites within Conservation Areas. The co-operation of Bassetlaw District Council and Gedling Borough Council is especially helpful in this respect.

The number of applications considered over the year again exceeded three hundred.

The annual coach trip was abandoned because of lack of support. This has largely come about because of the high cost of hiring a coach, which means that it must be almost full to be financially viable. Trips, however, were arranged to Fulbeck Hall and the adjacent Manor House (not normally open to the public) and to Norwood Park, including a tour of the house.

Michael Hurst again produced a much admired Newsletter. The number of editions is only limited by the volume of contributions made and this, unfortunately, has been very low. More input for the Newsletter is desperately needed.

The Harry Johnson Award, which is now copied by many other bodies, again came up with some very worthwhile projects, including some splendid new buildings in village settings. The winners were the Elderly Persons Flats and Bungalows at Negus Court, Lambley for the best new building and the Buttercross Veterinary Centre, Bingham for the best restoration of an old building. Such was the standard of the entries, that the judges also gave a Highly Commended Award to St Helen's Church, Burton Joyce for its new Church Centre.

The Trust has also joined and is an active participant in the Association of Preservation Trusts. Representatives from the Trust have attended meetings and seminars held in London, Keele and Great Witley, Worcester. This Association helps Building Preservation Trusts to exchange ideas and experiences and to keep each other informed on current thinking and legislation.

The Annual General Meeting was held at The Great Hall, Southwell Minster on Monday, 31st October 1994. After the business had been concluded, a talk was given by Mr David Ostick and family about the joys and hazards of restoring an old windmill. In this case, it was Tuxford Windmill, for which, amongst other awards, Mr Ostick had received the Harry Johnson Award for 1993 for the best restoration of an old building.
