#### REPORT ON THE YEAR'S ACTIVITIES

The work of the Trust is now under the direction of one Committee only, a combined Revolving Fund and Technical Panel which makes decisions to be confirmed by the elected Council of Management.

This has been done in order to reduce administration and avoid duplication of effort, although it is realised that some areas of interest might be missed as a result. It is hoped that individual members might take the initiative in drawing the attention of the Committee Members or Officers to items which they think are of interest to the Trust and have not been covered by the new system.

The Revolving Fund Committee, meeting at Newark, considered the following Schemes, among others:

- Shireoaks Station This is a disused station, although situated on a still active mineral railway. The building, with a limited parcel of land, had been offered to the Trust for £1, the offer had been accepted by the Trust and contracts were at present being exchanged. It is hoped that the station building can be restored for community use.
- 24 Moorgate and 16-28 Grove Street, East Retford These are two listed buildings of early 19th century date within the town centre of Retford, both in a semi-derelict condition. A feasibility study has been carried out which has suggested several courses of action for the Trust to follow and these are being pursued.
- Thoroton Dovecote This important 14th century building of more than local interest was under threat from development. Following negotiations with the builder, the dovecote was restored and given free to the Trust, together with a payment of  $\mathfrak{L}5,000$  to be invested for its future maintenance.
- Warden's Cottage, Misson The Trust purchased this small cottage in 1978 to save it from demolition and, owing to legal difficulties over ownership of part of the land, were frustrated in carrying out its restoration. The cottage has now been sold to a local resident who is confident that he can solve the problem using his local knowledge and connections.
- St. Leonard's Court Almshouses, Newark The most important decision taken by the Trust during the year was to acquire a terrace of six cottages very close to Newark Town Centre. There was a proposal to clear the site for redevelopment but the Trust agreed with Newark & Sherwood District Council to buy the cottages with a limited amount of land, in order to restore them to a high standard for eventual resale. Apart from saving a group of cottages, since listed as being of architectural and historic interest, the exercise would provide small low cost housing units within the town centre area.

Before its amalgamation with the Revolving Fund Committee, the Technical Panel held regular meetings to discuss Buildings at Risk, future events, items for the Newsletter and to consider planning applications. The Technical Advisers commented on over two hundred and forty planning applications, mostly in the Bassetlaw District and made written submissions to a number of planning appeals.

The Advisers were particularly concerned at the problems arising in Laxton where it was felt that new development was threatening the heart of the nationally important medieval village structure. Following representations to the District Council, it is hoped that a special forum, to consider planning applications affecting the character of Laxton, will be established.

The new format of the Newsletter, linking with other Conservation Groups to publish quarterly under the heading of 'Nottinghamshire Heritage', has been successful. The new publication has a far wider circulation than the previous publication and is subsidised by advertisers.

The Harry Johnson Award, which is run in conjunction with the C.P.R.E., has proved to be of exceptional interest. The award is for the best new building, or the restoration of an old building, within a village setting.

The quality of the submissions, mainly made by Parish Councils, has been very high and judging has been very difficult, as most deserved an award of some kind.

The first award was made to the owner of Watermill Barn, Linby, a derelict barn very successfuly converted to a dwelling, whilst retaining the character of the original building.

The 1989 Annual General Meeting was held at the Cathedrall Hall, Nottingham and attended by 57 members and friends. Following the business meeting, an illustrated talk was given by Dr. Robin Thornes of English Heritage, showing restoration work throughout the region.

On a sadder note, must be reported the sudden and unexpected death of the Chairman, Mr. Frank Higgins. This was a great loss, as his wide experience following a distinguished career as a Councillor in Local Government was of great value to the Trust.

Another sad death was that of Mr. Leonard Turton, who was a founder member of the Trust and, although the oldest member, was one of the most consistent attenders at meetings and always had a contribution to make.

Following his departure to another post, Mr. A. Sandford has ceased to be Honorary Legal Adviser to the Trust and we are fortunate that Mr. C.P. McKay has kindly consented to take over this role.
