## ANNUAL REPORT

The year 1974/75 proved to be a turning point in the Trust's history. The Trust entered the year in difficult financial circumstances and for several months had to impose a virtual moratorium on grant applications. At the conclusion of the year, however, the Trust emerged in a considerably strengthened position and with a clear conception of its priorities for the years ahead.

Grants have been made or offered during the financial year 1974/75 for work on the following properties:

In addition to the day to day work of the Trust in considering grant applications and planning applications affecting buildings within Conservation Areas, the Trust has continued to be engaged in a number of very substantial restoration projects, most notably, Windles Square, Calverton; Rempstone Cottages; and Ollerton Mill.

We are very pleased to report that the Trust has received a special grant of £300.00 towards the landscaping of Ollerton Mill and of £1,250.00 towards the landscaping of Windles Square in recognition of the importance of these projects to European Architectural Heritage Year. It is also appropriate to record here that Windles Square has been granted a Heritage Year Award. The Trust regards this Award as a considerable achievement, bearing in mind particularly that only four projects in the whole of the County received such an Award. The restoration of the Windles Square cottages has undoubtedly demonstrated that conservation of older properties makes an important contribution to the enhancement of the environment and also makes sound economic sense.

During the year the Trust took the initiative in arranging a special meeting for representatives of the new Local Authorities in the County. This was held at Scriby Hall by kind permission of the Dowager Viscountess Galway on 21st November, 1974 when the guest speakers were Mr. H. J. Lowe, and Dr. N. Summers. The meeting provided an opportunity for our spokesmen to outline the work of the Trust and to review its aims and achievements. It is significant that the meeting was attended by representatives of all nine Local Authorities in Nottinghamshire and undoubtedly paved the way for fruitful collaboration in the years to come.

In May, 1974 the Trust convened a Special General Meeting for the purpose of amending its Constitution to take account of local government reorganisation. The Nottinghamshire County Council is now represented on the Council of Management by five nominated County Councillors, and each subscribing District Council is also entitled to nominate one representative to serve upon the Council of Management.

At the Annual General Meeting held in the Council Chamber, County Hall, on 23rd September, 1974, the guest speaker was Mr. F. W. B. Charles, who presented an illustrated talk on the Old White Hart, Newark. The Trust is greatly indebted to Mr. Charles for his most stimulating address, particularly as he kindly accepted the engagement at very short notice when the previously arranged speaker had to withdraw due to the impending General Election.

A major development during the year has been the establishment of a Finance Sub-Committee (now designated the General Purposes Sub-Committee) which has met at regular intervals to review the Trust's financial operations and to help place our work on a sound footing. Arising from the Committee's detailed examination of the Trust's financial position it was agreed to sell the properties in the ownership of the Trust to the appropriate Local Authorities. The Trust is therefore in the process of selling the following properties: Windles Square cottages to the Gedling Borough Council; Rempstone Cottages to the Rushcliffe Borough Council; and Sunnyside Cottages, Southwell to the Nottinghamshire County Council. It will also be our intention to sell Bede House Chapel to the County Council in due course. Sale of these properties will enable the Trust to realise monies which would otherwise be tied up in bricks and mortar and will thus make it possible to expand our activities in our traditional sphere of offering grant applications to the owners of individual buildings.

At the Spring Meeting held at County Hall on May 22nd, 1974, the guest speaker was Mr. J. L. Nightingale, Director of the Orton Trust. Mr. Nightingale gave an illustrated talk on the activities of the Orton Trust and outlined its work in organising training courses for stonemasons. The Trust also arranged a coach tour for members which included visits to properties in the west of the County, embracing in particular the Old Rectory at Teversal and the Rectory at Warsop.

The Trust could not operate without substantial grant aid from Local Authorities and we wish to place on record our appreciation to the Nottinghamshire County Council and to all the District Councils for their continued support and encouragement for our work. We also wish to record our thanks to the Officers of these Authorities, in particular to Mr. A. Sandford, Director of Administration of the County Council, for kindly acting as the Trust's Honorary Legal Adviser and to the Director of Planning and Transportation, Mr. B. T. Collins, and his staff for their co-operation and assistance at all times.

The Trust is greatly indebted to our Honorary Technical Advisers who have again undertaken a very wide range of visits and reports on our behalf, including advising on grant applications, commenting on planning applications, and preparing evidence on behalf of the Trust at planning inquiries. The Technical Panel has met frequently throughout the year for this purpose. As recorded in our previous Annual Report Mr. H. Lee, formerly Deputy Director of Planning for Nottinghamshire County Council, is now part-time Technical Adviser to the Trust and has undertaken the bulk of reports made upon planning applications. Our warm thanks are due to him.

Finally, we wish to place on record our appreciation to all those Officers, Committee members, and interested individuals who have helped to further our work during a difficult but rewarding year. Thanks are due in particular to Mr. David Bowler and his colleagues in the Teaching Office, Department of Architecture, University of Nottingham for all their assistance with the Windles Square project; to Mr. John Dudding and his colleagues for their help with the Rempstone Cottages scheme; and to Mr. Guy St. J. Taylor for his guidance and co-operation in connection with Sunnyside Cottages, Southwell.

The Trust enters 1975/76 with a greatly increased membership, substantially improved financial prospects, and renewed confidence in the value of our work and its contribution to our heritage.

4. Contingent liabilities totalling £6,856 were outstanding, in respect of 23 grants offered but not taken up, at 31-3-75 of which six grants totalling £676 have since been withdrawn.

5. It has been the practice in recent years to charge all income and expenditure on properties acquired for renovation to the Revenue Account. It has been decided, however, that the net expenditure on each property should be capitalised and added to the cost of the property. It has therefore been necessary to re-appraise previous years accounts in this respect. Consequently the 1973-74 figures shown above differ from the figures presented last year. Details of the individual property figures are shown in note 1.
