ANNUAL REPORT

MEETINGS FOR MEMBERS

The 1975 Annual General Meeting of the Trust was held at Holme Pierrepont Hall on 31st October, by kind permission of Mr. and Mrs. R. G. L. Brackenbury. At this meeting an illustrated review of our work during the past year was presented by Mr. H. Lee and Mr. H. A. Johnson. Members of the Trust expressed their warm appreciation to Mr. and Mrs. Brackenbury for the opportunity of meeting in such pleasant and historic surroundings.

At the Spring Meeting, held on 6th June, at the Trebeck Hall, Bishop's Drive, Southwell, Mr. A. A. Wood, DIPL.ARCH., DIPL.T.P., R.I.B.A., F.R.T.P.I., presented an illustrated talk on European Architectural Heritage Year. Mr. Wood, who is an authority on buildings in the Midlands, gave a most stimulating address on the purpose of E.A.H.Y. and also reviewed the experience of other European countries in conserving and enhancing their architectural heritage.

A Coach Tour of properties was again arranged for members and friends. This was held on 18th September, 1975 and included visits to properties in Newark and district. We are indebted to our Technical Advisers, Dr. Summers and Mr. Lee, for arranging the itinerary of the Tour and commenting on the various properties visited in such an interesting way.

OFFICERS

In January 1976 Councillor A. E. Lester, J.P., tendered his resignation as Chairman of the Trust on the grounds of ill-health. The Council of Management accepted this resignation with considerable regret and took the opportunity of expressing to Councillor Lester the sincere appreciation of the Trust for all his years of service as our Chairman. Councillor Lester has served as Chairman since the inception of the Trust in 1967 and we are greatly indebted to him for his leadership and guidance during this formative period.

It was the unanimous decision of the Council of Management to invite Councillor Mrs. I. M. Skirving to serve as our new Chairman, and Professor M. W. Barley as Vice-Chairman. The new team is already in action and augurs well for the future of the Trust.

COMMITTEES

During the year it was agreed to set up a General Purposes Sub-Committee to replace the former Finance and Grants Sub-Committee. This is a decision making body, with power to make grants with a ceiling of £600 on any individual property.

It is now the practice of the Council of Management to meet quarterly and for the General Purposes Sub-Committee to meet midway between each Council meeting.

The Trust also found it necessary to set up a special Technical Advice Sub-Committee to review the need for a service of impartial technical advice to be provided to us. The Sub-Committee noted the changing situation affecting technical advice and, in particular, the fact that most District

Councils in Nottinghamshire were now in the process of setting up their own Conservation Area Advisory Committees whose function it will be to advise the Planning Committees on applications affecting buildings within Conservation Areas. In the light of this situation, and the resignation of our own Technical Advisers—noted later in the Report—it was agreed to accept, with thanks, the offer by the Nottinghamshire County Council of a service of part-time temporary help by officers of the Department of Planning and Transportation from 1st April, 1976.

TECHNICAL PANEL

During the year the membership of the Technical Panel has been severely depleted by resignations—Mr. H. A. Johnson and Professor G. B. Dix tendered their resignations in May, 1975; Dr. Norman Summers submitted his resignation, due to ill-health, in March 1976; and Mr. H. Lee terminated his employment as a part-time Technical Adviser in March 1976, at the instigation of the Council of Management, due to the reorganisation of the Trust's technical advisory service. The Trust has expressed its appreciation to each of these Technical Advisers and will of course be considering ways in which our technical services can be strengthened.

Over the years the Trust has been well served by its Honorary Technical Advisers, who have undertaken a considerable amount of voluntary service, and it is timely, therefore, to record our gratitude to them for the service they have given, without which it would not have been possible for the Trust to make such an impact in Nottinghamshire.

At the 1975 Annual General Meeting the Chairman presented a cheque to Mr. Johnson, being the proceeds of a presentation fund which had been subscribed to by members and friends.

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SALE OF PROPERTIES

The legal formalities in connection with the sale of Trust properties to the various Local Authorities were completed during the year, and transactions have been made as follows:

- Windles Square, Calverton*—sold to the Gedling Borough Council
- Rempstone Cottages*—sold to the Rushcliffe Borough Council
- Sunnyside Cottages, Southwell*—sold to the Nottinghamshire County Council

The sale of these properties has enabled the Trust to realise moneys which would otherwise have been tied up in buildings, and will thus make it possible for us to expand our activities in our traditional sphere of offering grants to the owners of individual properties.

Negotiations have also commenced for the sale of Bede House Chapel, together with its adjoining land, on which planning consent has now been obtained for the erection of old people's dwellings.

CONSERVATION AREA ADVISORY COMMITTEES

The Trust took the initiative in convening a meeting with representatives of the District Councils and the Nottinghamshire County Council to review the whole question of consultation on planning applications affecting Conservation Areas. It was noted that some Districts already had their own Conservation Area Advisory Committees or their equivalent; that others were in the process of setting them up; and some were not proposing to establish them. The Trust will be keeping this matter under continual review, and a further County-wide meeting of technical representatives will be convened at the appropriate time. Meanwhile, the Trust is continuing to provide technical advisory services to those Districts which have not yet established their own advisory machinery.

Keyworth Barn

At the time of preparing this Report the decision of the Secretary of State on the future of Keyworth Barn is still awaited, but it is appropriate to record that the Trust commissioned Mr. F. W. B. Charles, a noted authority on timber-framed buildings, to conduct a thorough technical survey of the Barn. Copies of Mr. Charles' report have been considered by the Trust and by the Rushcliffe Borough Council, and we are hopeful that it will be possible to find a practical use for the Barn and thus preserve the visual character of the Keyworth village scene.

G. Rhodes.

We also wish to record our thanks to the officers of those Authorities, in particular to Mr. A. Farrer, I.P.F.A., F.R.V.A., Treasurer of the Rushcliffe Borough Council, for kindly acting as our Honorary Treasurer.

The Trust is greatly indebted to its Technical Panel, who have again undertaken a very wide range of visits and reports on our behalf, and have held regular meetings during the year. The Trust hopes to have an opportunity, at a later date, of expressing thanks to those Technical Advisers who have felt unable to continue, but in this Report we wish them to be left in no doubt how much we have appreciated their service and how indebted the Trust is to them for their unstinting support and encouragement.

Finally, we wish to place on record our thanks to all those officers, Committee Members and interested individuals who have helped to further our work. It would be invidious to mention any particular individual by name, but the Trust has earned the goodwill and support of Local Authorities, architects and individuals throughout the County and our impact has been greatly enhanced by this support.

Throughout the past year the Trust has operated within a difficult climate of inflation and a continual decline in the value of money. We are proud to think that within the limits of our resources we have made an important contribution to the conservation of our architectural heritage, and there is no doubt that during the year ahead the Trust will be looking at ways of strengthening its financial structure and improving its publicity in order to increase membership and therefore widen our influence.
