## INTRODUCTION

The year covered by this Annual Report has been very mixed. On the one hand it has been a year in which the Trust has been involved with several major projects, notably the Farm Buildings Survey made possible by the Special Temporary Employment Programme. On the other hand, the Trust during the year suffered a major loss of revenue and had to withdraw its small grants policy. As a result of this, the Trust has had to look for new priorities and new roles.

## MEETINGS FOR MEMBERS

The 1979 Annual General Meeting of the Trust was held at Clifton Hall, by courtesy of the Dean of Education, Mr. W. Middlebrook, on Tuesday 23rd October. After the formal business of the meeting, there was an illustrated talk on recent activities of the Trust by Mr. G. Beaumont, following which members were given an opportunity to inspect the excellent restoration work that had been carried out on the Hall.

The annual Coach Tour took members out of the county to visit the Ironbridge Museum and those who attended had a most interesting and entertaining day. In addition to this, three contrasting walks were arranged at intervals during the summer, around Colston Bassett, Collingham and Sneinton.

## REDUCTIONS IN INCOME

The Trust received notification during the year that its usual grant which it had in the past received from Nottinghamshire County Council was to be withdrawn. This was a severe blow as it was expected that a grant of £9,000 to £10,000 would have been paid. Following representations to the Environment Committee, a modest grant of £500 was approved. The first direct result of the loss of income was that the Trust suspended the grants and loans which it had previously offered to owners restoring architecturally interesting buildings. It was also necessary to terminate the agreement whereby the Trust had professionally retained the services of Mr. John Severn as a technical adviser. We should like to take this opportunity of paying tribute to his tremendous expertise and enthusiasm and the long hours which he has given to the Trust, in excess of anything which we can reasonably expect. Mr. Severn will, however, continue to give help and advice on a voluntary basis as a member of the Trust. After a series of working party meetings, the Trust decided on the following priorities:

### (i) Revolving Fund Work

This would involve the Trust in acquiring and restoring buildings which would have to be sold to regenerate the capital involved. The Trust would seek the necessary capital through loans from the Architectural Heritage Fund and sympathetic local authorities;

### (ii) Public Inquiries

The Trust would continue to make vigorous representations at Public Inquiries where worthwhile buildings were under threat;

In addition the Buildings at Risk register was put on a firmer footing as a voluntary co-ordinator, Dr. M. A. L. Pringle, has undertaken to co-ordinate the work of the Register and to follow up the notifications received by the Trust.

### (iii) Advice to District Councils and Owners of Buildings

A voluntary Panel of Architects has been established to cover the county and the Trust relies on this Panel for advice in relation both to planning applications submitted to the Trust for comment by District Councils, and to requests for technical advice from private owners. In the latter case, a call-out charge of £10.00 is made to defray expenses.

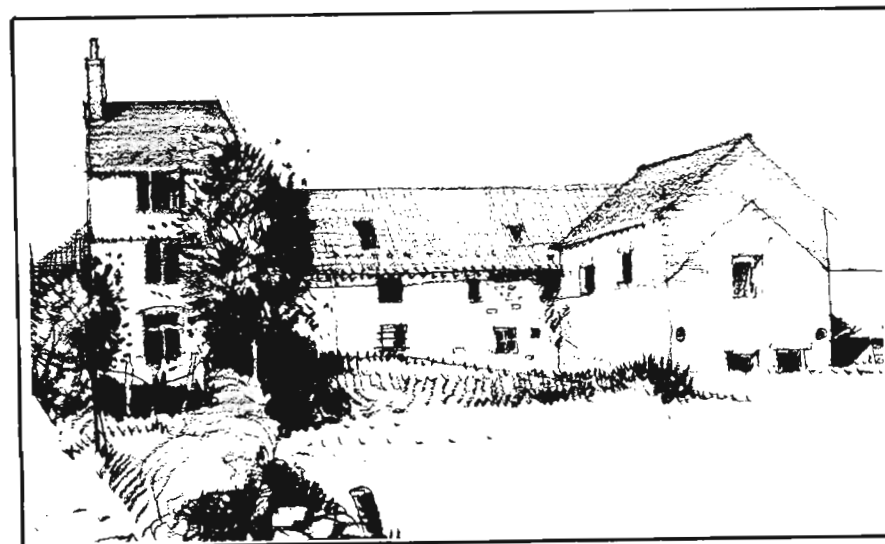

## PROPERTIES

### Bede House Chapel, Newark

The Trust has now, in co-operation with Newark District Council, completely restored the Chapel which has been transferred to the District Council who will be responsible for its future upkeep. It is likely to fulfill a new and useful role, at our suggestion, as a volunteer bureau organised by Newark Council for Voluntary Service.

Linby Lane, Papplewick

The Trust has successfully negotiated with the owners of this magnesian limestone house and its adjoining barn, to purchase the property for restoration and re-sale. It is hoped that the formal transaction will be completed during the coming year.

Firs Farm and Hollies Farm, Edwalton

These barns were identified as of interest through the Farm Buildings Survey described below. The Trust has co-operated with Rushcliffe Borough Council to ensure their retention; both properties are currently for sale, for restoration and conversion as dwelling units.

Holme Pierrepont Hall

The Trust has been able to provide substantial financial assistance to the Hall as a result of a grant received from the Thoresby Charitable Trust.

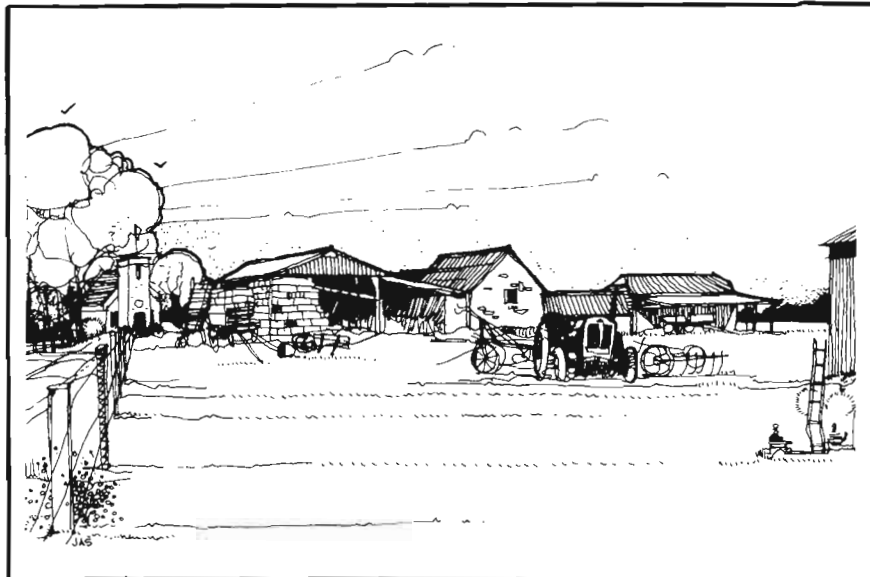

FARM BUILDINGS SURVEY

The Trust was able to employ a Farm Buildings Survey Team in co-operation with Task Force North. The team undertook a survey of architecturally interesting farm buildings in the Rushcliffe and Bassetlaw areas of the county. As a result of this, technical drawings were made of 26 previously unrecorded buildings.

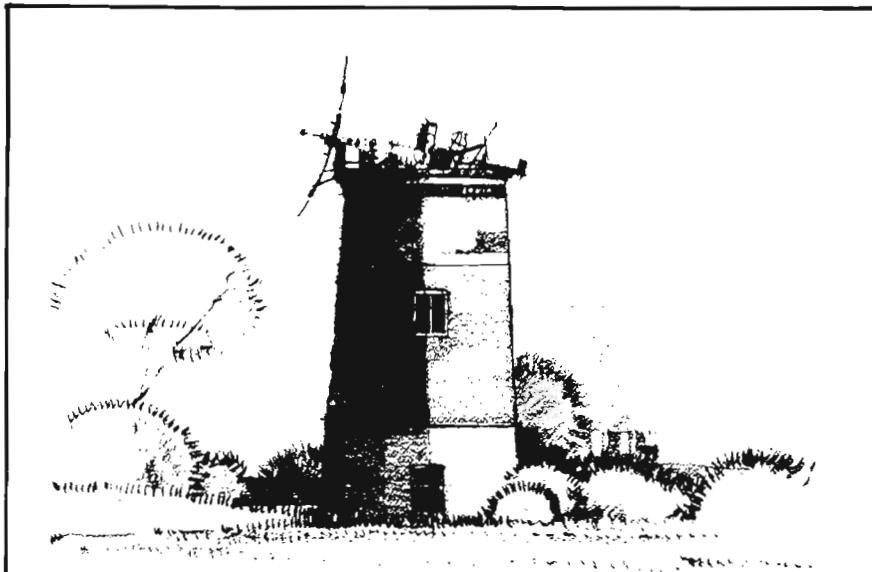
Some of the most interesting features uncovered by the team include:

C16 Butchers Shop at Collingham  
Late C18 model farm lit by gas at Cotgrave Place  
Barns at East Markham similar in construction to Sir Thomas Parkyn's barns at Bunny

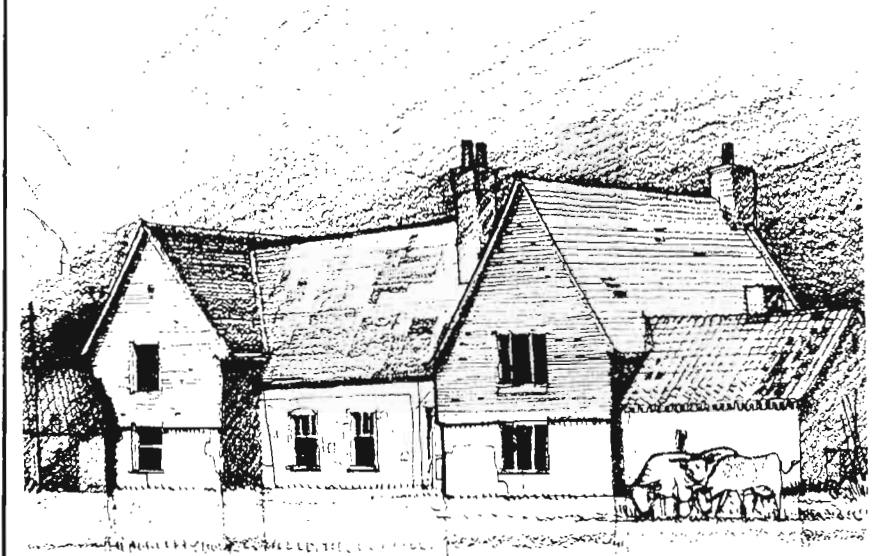
Although the project has come to an end, it is hoped to continue the work using voluntary involvement and support from interested local history and amenity societies.

BUILDINGS AT RISK

The Trust has, for a period of time, been compiling a register of buildings considered to be at risk. During the year the Register was put on a much firmer footing by the appointment of a voluntary co-ordinator to receive, review and follow up all notifications made to the Trust. As mentioned above, the Trust is continuing to compile and extend its Buildings at Risk register and Dr. M. A. L. Pringle is actively involved in following up notifications sent to the Trust. Although we learn through our normal

channels of many threatened buildings, it is particularly important that our members should, themselves, inform the Trust of buildings in their neighbourhood which are empty or appear to be threatened in some way. It is too late to regret the loss of a building once it has been demolished. It must be appreciated that there are sometimes insuperable difficulties in restoring buildings on our Register, and obviously, the Trust is not going to succeed in many of the cases. However, once a building is known to us, it is periodically reviewed and we are constantly looking for possible ways of restoring it to a new and viable use.
