REPORT ON THE YEAR'S ACTIVITIES

The year ending on 31st March, 1985, produced some positive results in the Trust's new policy of purchasing old buildings under threat, restoring them and bringing them back into active use.

The Trust was pleased to be involved in the restoration of No.3 Green's Gardens, Sneinton, part of the Green's Windmill group of buildings. The keys of the building were handed over to the Chairman of the Leisure Services Committee of the City Council at a ceremony held on 6th August, 1984. The cottage is now occupied by the caretaker of the Complex. The Trust has thus made its contribution to a collaborative effort which has had striking results.

Other buildings successfully restored and handed over were Newstead Lodge at the entrance to Newstead Abbey, and Forest Lodge, Mansfield Road, Nottingham. Forest Lodge provided a surprising amount of living accommodation and, being a well known landmark locally, aroused considerable interest and comment; fortunately, mostly favourable.

These successful projects were to a great measure due to the co-operation of Nottingham City Council, to whom the Trust is intensely grateful. The Northern Group of the Revolving Fund Committee have, however, not been idle. Ten buildings were studied in detail during the year and feasibility studies were commissioned for three. It is hoped that the co-operation of District Councils in the north and west of the County might improve as the ability of the Trust to carry out successful restoration work is demonstrated on the ground.

Both the Northern and Southern Groups continue to investigate old buildings under threat, either from neglect or from unsuitable development, and information from members on buildings so threatened is always welcome and, in fact, essential for the work to be successful.

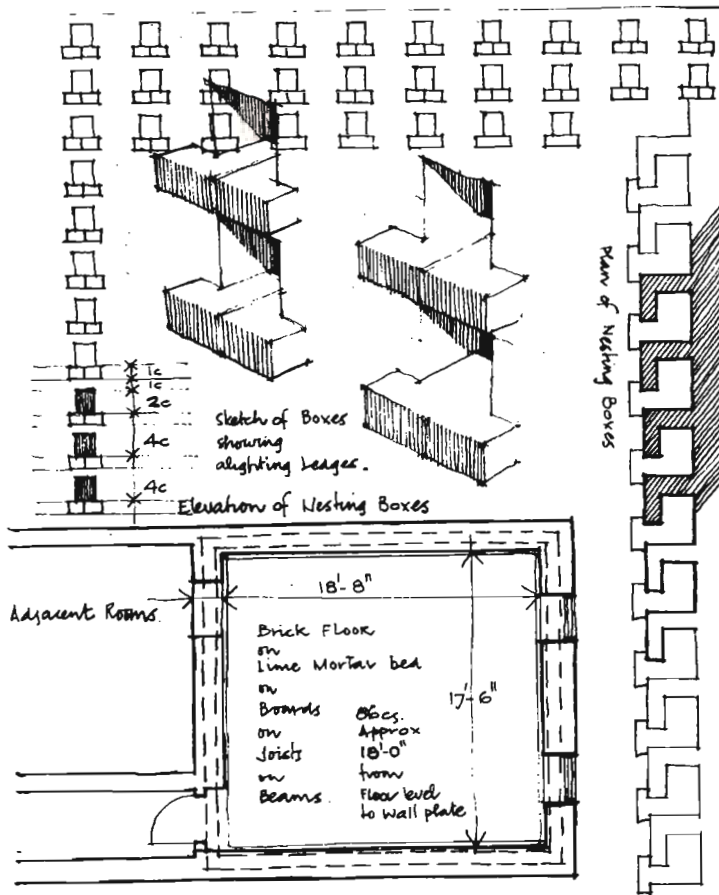
The 1984 Annual General Meeting was held at Colwick Hall when, after the business meeting, an illustrated talk was given by Mr. Graham Beaumont on Grant giving and its successes, and by Mr. John Severn on the work of the Revolving Fund Committees.

The Technical Advisers were invited to comment on one hundred and forty planning applications during the year. These concerned buildings in Conservation Areas and listed buildings elsewhere. The Governor's House, Newark, was one building that gave cause for concern, although as a result of the development a great deal of information resulted. In particular, it now seems from the evidence of dendrochronology that the front range was built c.1475 and the back range as much as a century later.

The Newsletter has continued to be published with the help of voluntary technical assistance. The content has been of interest and good quality and contributions from inclusion in the newsletter are always welcome.

It is with deep regret that we heard of the death of two founder members of the Trust during the year. Dr. Norman Summers and Mr. Keith Train, both of whom made great contributions to the work of the Trust. The Chairman has written an appreciation of the work of Dr. Summers and launched an appeal for a Norman Summers Memorial Fund. This is intended to be used to restore Wollaton Park Dovecote, which will be open to the public and will bear a plaque paying tribute to the work that Dr. Summers did in building up the reputation of the Trust, and in his academic work concerning the buildings of the County.

The annual Coach Tour for 1984 was to Newark visiting the Castle, the Governor's House and the Old White Hart. The visit was very rewarding and
